Pond-ering Maintenance

Our neighborhood retention ponds have been a common topic on the meeting agendas this year. The Board of Directors have been discussing and collecting quotes for two major projects for our two ponds. The first project, expected to be completed in January, will be the removal of a long row of bushes along the pond at the corner of Conner Grant and Adell. The hedge row had been damaged and had become unsightly.

The second project is more complex. The pond on Conner Grant will require repair work to the forebay berm. The water level will need to be lowered for this work. The pond off Joshua Norman is showing erosion of the inlet pipe. Both ponds require new rock at the dissipator pads to decrease velocity of water flow to help prevent further erosion. But don't worry, our ponds are fully functional and are maintained monthly by a certified company.
